


Bobcat Choir Update:



- 1. **Bobcat Business:** Who plays in the garding club?
- **Mr. Filosi:** Preston Heath and Carey Blackwell are competing in the Super Smash Bros. Ultimate tournament this year. (Wyatt Clark also attended most of our practice days, but we never got enough players for a Rocket League team.)
- 2. **BB:** How long do they play?
- **Mr. F:** Match length varies, but for Smash Bros. the matches are capped at 7 minutes each, best 3 out of 5. So, you have 35 minutes max play time on tournament days if you have to play all 5 matches.
- 3. **BB:** What other activities make games?
- Mr. F: Game options for the Esports tournament this year are:

Cheer for the Bobcats



Tillamook PUD Line Worker Program Scholarship

There are two Electric Lineworker Program Scholarships available. The scholarships are intended to increase your knowledge of the utility industry as well as the lineman trade. If you are successful in being selected, \$10,000 will be paid to your school account upon confirmation of your enrollment at a recognized Electrical Lineworker Program (ELP). Applicants must complete a recognized ELP within 24 months of enrollment in the ELP to be eligible. This scholarship is non-transferable to a future ELP.

HIGH SCHOOL WORK PROGRAM




