Guests at School Dances

The Board recognizes the social aspect of school and provides its students with the opportunity to attend school-sponsored dances. While its primary responsibility is to its own students, the Board acknowledges that some students will want to bring guests to dances.

In order to maintain a controlled social environment, the following guidelines will be observed at all school dances:

- 1. Any student who wishes to bring a guest must request a pass from the office during the week of the dance. The passes will be issued by the principal or athletic director;
- 2. No elementary or middle school students will be admitted as guests at high school dances;
- 3. No one who is 21 or older will be admitted as a guest at high school dances;
- 4. Each guest must be accompanied into the dance by the high school student who requested the pass; the pass must be shown to the chaperone at the door. Students are responsible for the behavior of their guest; if the guest is a problem, both may be asked to leave and the Nestucca High School student may lose dance privileges;
- 5. Chaperones may use their own judgement as to whether to admit a guest, even if the above criteria have been met.
