

Use of Feature Films/Videos in the School**

Prior to showing a commercially produced and rated feature film/video in a school, the instructor must have prior approval of the principal. At least five days prior to the showing, the instructor shall submit to the principal (in writing) the following information on the particular film:

1. Title and brief description;
2. Purpose for the showing;
3. Match with course objectives;
4. Proposed date of showing;
5. When and how parents will be notified, or if necessary, grant consent;
6. Audience rating.

Additionally, the following requirements must be met:

1. Elementary Level K-5:
 - a. "G" rated films may be shown with prior principal approval. Prior parental notification is not required;
 - b. "PG" rated films may be shown with prior principal approval. Prior parental notification and permission is also required;
 - c. "PG-13" and "R" rated films are prohibited.
2. Middle School 6-8:
 - a. "G" rated films may be shown with prior principal approval. Prior parental notification is not required;
 - b. "PG" and "PG-13" rated films may be shown with prior principal approval. Prior parental notification and permission is also required;
 - c. "R" rated films are prohibited.
3. High School 9-12:
 - a. "G" and "PG" rated films may be shown with prior principal approval. Prior parental notification is not required;
 - b. "PG-13" rated films may be shown with prior principal approval. Prior parental notification and permission is also required;

- c. “R” rated films must have Board approval and parental consent.

Instructors are required to preview all film media before showing to students.

Edited or unrated films/videos will be shown at the discretion of the administrator.
