Superintendent's Message

February 9, 2018

Parents and Friends,

As we move through winter, towards spring, you will begin to see more invitations from the school district to attend school facilities meetings. As many of you know, the district was awarded a \$4 million matching grant from the Oregon Department of Education. This grant is only accessible to our district if the voters pass a bond levy to improve facilities in the Nestucca Valley School District on the May 15, 2018 election. If the bond does not pass, the \$4 million will be awarded to another district. The district has been planning and working towards securing this grant for the past three years. As a community member you will begin to see hand-outs, web updates, and community meetings concerning the potential of this facilities improvement. The district is also very interested in fielding any questions you may have concerning the facilities proposal.

The board of directors has yet to take action to place a resolution on the May 2018 ballot. At the February 12, 2018 regularly scheduled board meeting there will be an agenda item concerning a proposed bond levy.

As we approach Spring, many classes will be planning their field trips. If you anticipate wanting to attend your student's field trip you must first fill out a volunteer criminal background check. These criminal history checks are good for three years. If you have completed one before and are not certain if yours has expired, please contact the school office. The application process is very quick.

We have started a 9th Grade On Track committee at Nestucca. Statistics show that Freshman who fail a class have a much greater risk of not graduating than those who start their high school years passing all of their classes and working diligently. First Class Scholars Program Scholarship Application 2018

The TBCC First Class Scholars Program 2018 is a tuition scholarship available to qualified Tillamook County high school or home school graduates. As long as the student maintains his or her eligibility, Tillamook Bay Community College will award a tuition scholarship for fall, winter, and spring terms for the 2018 and 2019 years or until the student earns his or her first degree, whichever comes first. Selection for the program will be based on the quality and completeness of the application and essay. Typically we have been able to award this scholarship to between 15-20 students annually!

Eligibility Requirements:

- Career Technical Degree Option**
 - Graduate from a Tillamook County high school 2018
 - Earn a cumulative unweighted GPA of 2.5 or better by the end of first semester of senior year
 - Be eligible to enroll in Math 70 and Writing 121
- University Transfer Degree Option**
 - Graduate from a Tillamook County high school in 2018
 - Earn a cumulative unweighted GPA of 3.0 or better by the end of first semester of senior year
 - Eligible to enroll in Math 95 and Writing 121

WHAT... is Oregon Promise?

Oregon Promise is a state grant that covers most tuition at any Oregon community college for recent high school graduates and GED® recipients.

WHO... is eligible?



Be a recent Oregon high school graduate or GED® recipient



Have a 2.5 cumulative GPA or higher



Plan to attend an Oregon community college within 6 months of graduation



Be an Oregon resident at least 12 months prior to attendance

Starting in 2017-2018, your eligibility may be determined by your Expected Family Contribution (EFC). The EFC criteria is subject to change. Visit the website for more information.

HOW... do I apply for Oregon Promise?

- 1 Go to OregonStudentAid.gov.
- 2 Create an account in the OSAC Student Portal.
- 3 Complete the Oregon Promise Application.
- 4 File your FAFSA or ORSAA and list at least one Oregon community college.



HOW... will I know if I am awarded?

The Office of Student Access and Completion (OSAC) will notify you by email about your application and/or award status. You can also check your OSAC Student Portal account for all updates.

THE WILDCAT WAY



The question of when a child is too sick to attend school is not always as easy to answer as it seems. Often parents need to make judgments about whether to send their child to school and see if they feel better or keep them home and have them rest. Below are some guidelines to help you make this often difficult decision. The following guidelines were developed to help prevent the spread of potentially contagious diseases.

Please keep your child home if he/she has any of the following symptoms:

Symptom	Explanation
Fever	Greater than 100.5°F; student may return when fever-free for 24 hours (WITHOUT use of fever-reducing medicine)
Vomiting	More than 2 times in the preceding 24 hours, unless determined to be from non-communicable conditions; student may return when resolved
Diarrhea	3 or more watery or loose stools in 24 hours; student may return when resolved for 24 hours
Stiff Neck	Or headache with accompanying fever; student may return after resolution of symptoms or diagnosis made and health provider clearance given
Rash	Any new onset of rash if accompanied by fever; student may return after rash resolves or diagnosis is made and health provider clearance given
Jaundice	Yellowing of eyes or skin; may return after diagnosis from physician and clearance given
Skin Lesions (Sores)	Drainage that cannot be contained within a bandage
Other	Symptoms or complaints that prevent the student from active participation in usual school activities


If your child is diagnosed with a communicable disease, please notify the school as soon as possible. Some students have medical conditions that require special care if they are exposed to certain illnesses. Home is the best place for a child who is ill. If your child is sick and will be missing school, please call the school office to report the absence.



Recorder Karate!

What is “Recorder Karate”? It is a positive reward system in which students receive colored "karate belts" to hang from their recorders for each progressively more difficult tune they play for Ms. Stirling. We start with Hot Cross Buns, which is the white belt song, and progress through eight more folk songs, the last being “Ode to Joy”.

Students in fourth grade have to “test”, or play the song for Ms. Stirling before school or at another time besides music class if they want to participate in Recorder Karate. We currently have five student who have earned their Black Belt this year, Pedro S, Jayden W, Jace O, Ariyana C and Ana W. Students receive a certificate celebrating earning their black belt.
